Wellness Health Care For Your Dog

At Indian Hills Animal Clinics we understand that every pet is unique. Factors, such as age, breed, and type of environment your dog is exposed to, carry with them certain risks and health needs. This brochure is intended to give you an overview of our recommendations. However, based on your dog's individual needs and risks, our doctors will determine what is needed for your pet's optimum health.

Fleas

Fleas are a very common problem in dogs that spend any time outdoors or live with another dog or cat that spends time outdoors. Fleas also act as vectors (carriers) of tapeworms, an intestinal parasite. Flea control is best achieved by having a thorough understanding of the flea life cycle and formulating a plan to disrupt it. Flea control and prevention must address both the environment (house and yard), where the egg, larvae, and pupa live, and all the pets in the household, where the adult fleas are. *See our Flea brochure for more information.*

Heartworms

Heartworm disease is a serious and potentially fatal disease seen in dogs. Dogs acquire heartworms through the bite of an infected mosquito. Heartworm disease is a very preventable disease. *See our Heartworm Disease brochure for more information.*

Sentinel

There are five key parasites that pose a threat to your dog's health: fleas, heartworms, roundworms, hookworms (*A. caninum*) and whipworms. Plus, because SENTINEL® Flavor Tabs® are oral flavor tabs, they are clean, convenient and safe for households with children.

Physical Exam: A complete examination evaluating all organ systems. You receive a comprehensive report identifying and explaining our findings and recommendations. In dogs over 7 years of age twice-a-year physical examinations are necessary for early disease detection.	\$49.50	\$49.50	\$49.50
Rabies Vaccine: A fatal and highly contagious viral disease. Required by law. Currently, vaccines are available that allow your dog to be protected for 3 years, therefore reducing the frequency of vaccinations necessary. Rabies is a risk to you and your family & prevention is key.	\$12.50	\$12.50	
DHAPP (Distemper/Parvo Vaccine): This vaccine protects from a variety of viral diseases that are highly contagious and potentially life threatening. Recommended for all dogs. This vaccine is always done in conjunction with a Physical Exam. Only needed once every three years in previously vaccinated adult dogs over two years of age.	\$16.00	\$16.00	
Leptospirosis Vaccine: Leptospirosis is a highly contagious parasite that leads to kidney & liver failure in dogs. Wichita and the surrounding area have become a "hot spot" for this disease. This vaccine is given yearly and provides protection against some of the most common and pathogenic strains of the disease.	\$25.00	\$25.00	
Bordetella (ITII or "Kennel Cough") Vaccine: This vaccine protects from a highly contagious upper respiratory disease that produces coughing, sneezing, and sometimes nasal discharge. This airborne disease is most often transmitted at boarding facilities, grooming shops, and parks. Your dog can also contract this disease in its own yard. Recommended for all dogs. This vaccine needs to be updated every 6 months.	\$16.50	\$16.50	
Borrelia (Lymes) Vaccine: If your dog is routinely exposed to ticks, then this vaccine is highly recommended. Lyme disease can cause symptoms such as joint pain, fever, depression, and loss of appetite. This vaccine is always done in conjunction with a Physical Exam.	\$32.00	\$32.00	
Spay or Neuter: If your dog is not spayed or neutered we highly recommend doing so to avoid unwanted puppies and to avoid health risks like pyometra (a life threatening disease in females), breast cancer, testicular cancer, and prostate disease.	yes	yes	yes
Fecal Exam: This examination consists of two tests that check for 7 different intestinal parasites. Dogs should be checked yearly. Some of these parasites can be a risk to you and your family.	\$21.00	\$21.00	
Heartworm Testing: A current heartworm test is recommended to ensure your dog is negative for this disease.	\$35.00	\$35.00	yes

Diagnostic Screening: To minimize potential risk and provide you and us with peace of mind, we recommend pre-anesthetic blood testing prior to your pet being placed under anesthesia. These tests look for anemia, diabetes, kidney and liver problems.	yes		yes
